Introduction:

You were created to live blessed and joyful.

Not just someday... but today.

Each day, I clung to the promise found in Psalm 23:6:

“Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life...”

I recited it daily for nearly a year. And while my circumstances didn't change overnight, something in me began to shift. My faith grew deeper. My perspective became clearer. And my heart started to rediscover joy—not the temporary kind, but the kind rooted in God's goodness, blessings, and everlasting love.

That's what Joy for Today is all about.

This 31-day devotional is for the woman who's trying her best to keep going. The one who has faith, but sometimes feels weary. The one who wants to believe her life can still be beautiful and full of purpose—no matter what season she's in.

Each day, you'll receive a scripture, a devotional reflection, and encouragement to press into God's promises. Not just to survive, but to live with resilient joy—a joy that's deeply rooted, steady, and full of hope.

So open your heart, grab your Bible, and let's rediscover joy—one day at a time.

How to Use This Devotional

Welcome to Joy for Today! This isn't just a book to read—it's a journey to experience.

Each day includes:

- A Scripture to meditate on
- A Devotional Thought to uplift and inspire
- A Reflection Question to connect God's Word with your life
- A Choose Joy Prompt to practice joy with intention
- Prayer – to talk with your Heavenly Father and invite Him into your day

Don't rush the process—this is a 31-day journey meant to be savored, and evoke inner joy.

Use the Joy Checklist at the front to build joy habits daily, weekly, and monthly.

Space is provided in the back of the devotional for journaling, gratitude, and prayer notes.

Most of all, keep praying. Prayer is not optional—it's the air we breathe as daughters of the King. Let every page lead you closer to God's heart and deeper into resilient joy.

Your Joy Checklist

Let this be your gentle reminder: Joy is not selfish—it's sacred.

You were created to enjoy your life, not just endure it. Use this checklist to make space for joy every day, every week, and every month as you move through this devotional.

Daily Joy Boosters

Pick one or more each day:

- Smile at yourself in the mirror and thank God for a new day
- Read or recite a favorite scripture (start with Psalm 23:6)
- Step outside and notice something beautiful in creation
- Listen to a worship song that lifts your spirit
- Laugh at a funny video or meme
- Compliment someone—and mean it
- Write down one thing you're grateful for

Weekly Joy Builders

Pick at least one each week:

- Treat yourself to your favorite coffee, tea, or smoothie
- Spend 30 minutes doing something just for fun (no guilt!)
- Plan a quiet moment with God—just you, your journal, and His presence
- Take a walk and pray as you go
- Call or text someone who brings light into your life
- Take a break from social media and read something uplifting
- Celebrate a small win—you're doing better than you think!

Monthly Joy Moments

Make space for one joyful experience this month:

- Take a mini road trip or nature outing
- Book a massage, facial, or intentional rest day
- Create a Joy Vision Board or Pinterest mood board
- Host or attend a faith-filled brunch or women's gathering
- Invest in something that brings you joy (a journal, flowers, a good book)
- Do something bold you've been putting off—yes, that thing

As you move through this devotional, use the pages to dream again, to reflect, and to plan moments of joy on purpose. God is with you—and so is your joy.

Day 1: Clothed in Joy

Scripture of the Day

“I delight greatly in the Lord; my soul rejoices in my God. For he has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of his righteousness...” — Isaiah 61:10

Devotional Thought

God didn't leave you uncovered—He clothed you in salvation, wrapped you in righteousness, and gave you joy that no one can take away. This verse reminds us that our joy isn't rooted in how we feel, but in what God has already done.

When life feels messy, it's easy to forget you're dressed in victory. But your spiritual wardrobe has already been picked out—one of hope, healing, and honor. When you wake up and choose joy, you're putting on what God has already provided.

Start your week wearing the truth: you are covered in God's love, surrounded by His grace, and wrapped in a joy that runs deep.

Reflect

What spiritual “clothing” are you wearing today—worry, shame, or joy and righteousness?

Choose Joy Today

Get dressed with intention. As you get ready for your day, declare this: “I am clothed in joy, covered in righteousness, and ready to walk in God’s purpose.”

Prayer

Lord, thank You for clothing me in salvation and joy. I don’t have to earn it—it’s Your gift to me. Help me to walk boldly in the covering You’ve given me and to reflect Your joy wherever I go. Amen.



Day 2: Fullness of Joy

Scripture of the Day

“You make known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand.” — Psalm 16:11

Devotional Thought

True joy isn't found in a paycheck, a person, or even a perfect day—it's found in God's presence. Psalm 16 reminds us that He not only shows us the path of life, but He fills us with joy when we spend time with Him. That's not a partial joy or a momentary thrill—it's fullness of joy.

When was the last time you sat still in God's presence—not to ask, not to plan, but just to be with Him? There is a calm, unshakable joy that rises when your heart rests in the hands of your Heavenly Father.

Make time for Him today. Don't wait until your schedule opens up. Step into His presence now—even for five minutes. Joy will meet you there.

Reflect

What brings you closest to God's presence—worship, prayer, silence, nature? How can you make more space for that?

Choose Joy Today

Take five intentional minutes today to sit in quiet with God. No distractions. Just breathe, worship, and welcome His presence.

Prayer

Lord, thank You for showing me the path of life. Help me slow down and make time for Your presence. Fill my heart with joy that doesn't fade and remind me that in You, I have everything I need. Amen.



Day 3: Joy Is a Gift

Scripture of the Day

“To the person who pleases him, God gives wisdom, knowledge and happiness...” — Ecclesiastes 2:26

Devotional Thought

Joy is not something you have to manufacture—it's something God gives. When your heart is surrendered to Him, He responds with blessings that go beyond things—He gives you wisdom, understanding, and joy.

This verse is a reminder that joy isn't just a feeling—it's a gift wrapped in relationship. As you walk with God, He fills your life with more than you could ever earn or chase on your own.

So today, stop striving. Simply receive. Joy isn't something you fight for—it's something you're favored with. And it's yours to walk in with confidence.

Reflect

Do you see joy as something you need to earn or something you're invited to receive? What might change if you viewed it as a gift?

Choose Joy Today

Write this truth somewhere visible: "Joy is a gift, and I receive it today." Say it aloud and let your heart rest in God's goodness.

Prayer

Father, thank You for the gift of joy. Help me not to strive or stress, but to receive what You freely give. Fill my heart with wisdom, peace, and happiness as I walk with You today.
Amen.



Day 4: Complete Joy

Scripture of the Day

“I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.” — John 15:11

Devotional Thought

Jesus didn't just want us to have a little joy—He wants our joy to be complete. Full. Lacking nothing. That's the kind of joy He left with His disciples, and it's the kind of joy He offers you today.

This verse comes after Jesus teaches about staying connected to Him, the true vine. Joy isn't something you manufacture by trying harder—it flows when you remain close to Him. When your heart is rooted in His love, joy naturally blooms.

You don't have to settle for temporary happiness. Jesus offers lasting, soul-deep joy that carries you through anything. Stay close to Him—and let His joy become your strength.

Reflect

Are you staying connected to Jesus in this season? What might be stealing your joy or distracting you from His presence?

Choose Joy Today

Do something that reconnects you with Jesus: read a favorite passage, pray aloud, or write Him a letter of gratitude.

Prayer

Jesus, thank You for offering me joy that is complete. Help me to stay connected to You today and not chase joy anywhere else. Let Your joy take root in me and overflow into everything I do. Amen.



Day 5: Rejoice Again

Scripture of the Day

“Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!”
— Philippians 4:4

Devotional Thought

Joy is so important that Paul says it twice in one sentence: Rejoice... again I say, rejoice! And he didn't write this from a place of comfort—he was in prison. Still, Paul had learned the secret: joy isn't based on where you are, but who you're with.

When life feels repetitive or hard, it's easy to forget joy. But this verse is a bold reminder that joy is not a one-time decision—it's a rhythm. A habit. A holy attitude that lifts you out of heaviness.

Even on days when it's hard to smile, choose to rejoice. Not because everything is good—but because God is still good.

Reflect

What's one thing you can rejoice in today—right where you are?

Choose Joy Today

Speak a praise out loud today, even if you don't feel like it. Sing, hum, or write a list of five blessings you're thankful for.

Prayer

Lord, help me rejoice today—again and again. Even when I don't feel joyful, remind me that praise is powerful. Thank You for always being worthy of celebration. Fill my heart with fresh joy. Amen.



Day 6: Joy and Peace in Believing

Scripture of the Day

“May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.” — Romans 15:13

Devotional Thought

Joy and peace are not things you have to chase—they come as a result of trusting in God. When you place your faith in Him, He doesn't just give you a little joy—He fills you with it. And that joy doesn't just stay inside you—it overflows.

Sometimes we want joy without surrender, peace without trust. But this verse reminds us that believing is the gateway. When you lean into God's promises and rest in His care, He fills you up from the inside out.

Let today be a reminder: your hope is not empty. The God of hope is filling you with everything you need—joy, peace, and strength to keep going.

Reflect

Is there an area in your life where you're struggling to trust God? What might happen if you surrendered it fully?

Choose Joy Today

Take one area of stress or fear and pray over it. Say out loud: "God, I trust You with this." Then do something restful—light a candle, take a bath, or sit quietly with worship music.

Prayer

God of hope, thank You for filling me with joy and peace as I trust in You. Strengthen my faith today, and help me surrender every worry so that I can overflow with Your hope and joy. Amen.



Day 7: God Rejoices Over You

Scripture of the Day

“The Lord your God is with you, the Mighty Warrior who saves. He will take great delight in you; in his love he will no longer rebuke you, but will rejoice over you with singing.” — Zephaniah 3:17

Devotional Thought

Can you imagine God singing over you? Not with disappointment or demands, but with delight. This verse paints a beautiful picture of God’s heart—He’s not just near you, He’s joyful about you.

Sometimes we think of God as distant or disapproving, especially when we fall short. But the truth is: He delights in you. His love is steady. His joy over you is loud. And when you let that truth sink in, it’s impossible not to smile.

You don’t have to earn His affection—it’s already yours. Today, rest in the joy of knowing that the God of the universe rejoices over you.

Reflect

Do you see yourself the way God sees you? What might shift in your life if you truly believed He delights in you?

Choose Joy Today

Look in the mirror and say, “God delights in me.” Write it down. Believe it. Let His joy become your own.

Prayer

Father, thank You for rejoicing over me with singing. I’m in awe that You delight in me—not for what I do, but for who I am in You. Help me to walk in that truth and reflect Your joy today. Amen.



Day 8: The Strength of Joy

Scripture of the Day

“Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.”

— Nehemiah 8:10

Devotional Thought

Sometimes joy feels out of reach—especially when life is heavy. In Nehemiah 8, God’s people had just heard the Word and were weeping, aware of how far they had fallen. But Nehemiah told them not to grieve, because God’s joy—not their shame—would be their strength.

This same truth applies to you. Your joy doesn’t have to come from your circumstances. It doesn’t come from everything going right. It comes from the Lord. His joy is steady. His joy is restoring. And His joy gives you supernatural strength to stand, smile, and move forward even when things aren’t perfect.

You don’t have to earn this joy. Just receive it. Lean into it. Let the joy of the Lord strengthen your soul today.

Reflect

What would change in your heart or attitude if you truly believed that God's joy gives you strength?

Choose Joy Today

Speak this out loud: "The joy of the Lord is my strength."
Then do something that makes you smile—listen to a song, bake something sweet, or look through happy photos.

Prayer

Father, thank You that Your joy is my strength. Even when life feels uncertain, You give me reason to smile. Help me walk in that joy today, and remind me that it's a gift I can always receive from You. Amen.



Day 9: Good News of Great Joy

Scripture of the Day

“But the angel said to them, ‘Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people.’”

— Luke 2:10

Devotional Thought

Joy is not a small gift—it’s a divine announcement. When Jesus came into the world, Heaven’s message wasn’t fear, pressure, or condemnation. It was good news that brings great joy.

God still speaks that message over you today. No matter what your circumstances look like, Jesus is the proof that joy has come. Not temporary, surface-level joy—but deep, lasting, soul-reviving joy.

You don’t need a holiday to celebrate this truth. You just need a heart open to the wonder of what God has done. Let today be a joyful reminder: the good news is still good. And it’s for you.

Reflect

What's one part of the "good news" of Jesus that brings you the most joy right now?

Choose Joy Today

Celebrate like it's Christmas—play your favorite worship song, light a candle, or give a small gift to someone who needs encouragement.

Prayer

Jesus, thank You for being the good news that brings great joy. Help me not to lose the wonder of who You are and why You came. Fill my heart with fresh joy today, and let it overflow to others. Amen.



Day 10: Joy Comes in the Morning

Scripture of the Day

“Weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning.” — Psalm 30:5

Devotional Thought

Grief, disappointment, and pain may visit—but they are not permanent residents. This verse gently reminds us that sorrow has a time limit. Even if your “night” has felt long, morning is promised—and with it comes joy.

Joy doesn’t always wait until everything is fixed. Sometimes, it sneaks in slowly with the sunrise, reminding you that new mercies are here. That you’re still breathing. That God is still faithful.

If you’re in a season of weeping, know this: you’re not stuck. Morning is on the way. Your joy is coming, and it won’t be late.

Reflect

What “night” season has God brought you through—or is bringing you through? How has His faithfulness shown up in small ways?

Choose Joy Today

Take a moment to reflect on a past season God brought you out of. Write down one way your life is better now than it was then.

Prayer

Father, thank You that no season lasts forever. When nights feel long, remind me that joy is coming. Thank You for being with me in the dark and for bringing light into my life again. I receive Your joy today. Amen.



Day 11: Laughter Restored

Scripture of the Day

“Our mouths were filled with laughter, our tongues with songs of joy. Then it was said among the nations, ‘The Lord has done great things for them.’ The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy.” — Psalm 126:2–3

Devotional Thought

God is the restorer of laughter. These verses are a testimony—after years of captivity, God’s people were brought back home. And what did they do? They laughed. They sang. They overflowed with joy.

There’s something holy about laughter after a hard season. It’s a sign that healing is taking root and hope is rising again. When people see your joy and ask, “What happened?” you can say with confidence: The Lord has done great things for me.

Your story is still unfolding, but joy can be part of it now— not just later. God is still in the business of bringing beauty from ashes. He hasn’t forgotten you. He’s preparing your joy-filled testimony.

Reflect

Has God ever restored your joy after a difficult season? What “great things” has He done that make you want to praise Him?

Choose Joy Today

Watch or listen to something that makes you genuinely laugh. Let laughter be your offering today—and your reminder that God is restoring you.

Prayer

Lord, thank You for the laughter You bring after long nights and hard seasons. You have done great things for me, and I choose to rejoice. Restore what’s been lost, and fill my heart with joy again. Amen.



Day 12: Joy You Can't Explain

Scripture of the Day

“Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls.” — 1 Peter 1:8-9

Devotional Thought

Some days, joy doesn't make sense—but it's there. Not because of your circumstances, but because of your Savior. This verse speaks to a powerful truth: even though we've never seen Jesus face to face, we love Him—and in that love, we find inexpressible and glorious joy.

This is the kind of joy the world can't understand. It's not based on logic or proof. It's based on faith. It's rooted in the deep knowing that Jesus is real, He's near, and He's saving your soul every day.

So if you're smiling for no reason, singing when things are still hard, or holding peace in the middle of pressure—that's the inexpressible joy of God at work in you.

Reflect

Have you ever experienced joy that you couldn't fully explain? How has your faith helped you hold on to joy?

Choose Joy Today

Write a short letter or prayer to Jesus telling Him what you love about Him—even though you haven't seen Him. Let your love for Him overflow into joy.

Prayer

Jesus, I love You. Even though I haven't seen You with my eyes, I've felt Your presence and know You are real. Fill me with a joy that can't be explained—just experienced. Thank You for saving me and being near. Amen.



Day 13: Rejoice in Today

Scripture of the Day

“This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.” — Psalm 118:24

Devotional Thought

You don't have to wait for a “perfect” day to rejoice—today is enough. Whether it started slow or busy, this day is a gift. It was handcrafted by God, filled with opportunities to experience His goodness.

Joy begins when you stop waiting for better days and start noticing God in the one you're living right now. The sunrise, the breath in your lungs, the quiet moments of grace—all of it is reason to rejoice.

This verse is not just a declaration—it's a mindset. Choose to enter today with gladness. Celebrate the little things. Look for evidence of His hand all around you. This day belongs to the Lord, and so does your joy.

Reflect

What's one thing about today you can be grateful for, even if everything isn't perfect?

Choose Joy Today

Pause and say aloud: "This is the day the Lord has made. I will rejoice and be glad in it." Then write down three blessings you noticed today.

Prayer

Lord, thank You for this day. No matter how it began or what it holds, I choose to rejoice because You made it. Help me see the beauty in today and to walk in joy, one moment at a time. Amen.



Day 14: No One Can Take Your Joy

Scripture of the Day

“So with you: Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy.” — John 16:22

Devotional Thought

Jesus spoke these words to His disciples right before His crucifixion. He knew they were about to face deep sorrow—but He also gave them this promise: joy is coming, and nothing can take it away.

There’s a kind of joy that isn’t tied to circumstances or emotions. It’s a joy rooted in the resurrection. It’s anchored in the truth that Jesus lives—and because He lives, hope lives too. That kind of joy can’t be stolen.

People may disappoint you. Situations may shift. But the joy Jesus gives is eternal. If He’s your source, then your joy is secure.

Reflect

What have you allowed to steal your joy in the past? How can you reclaim it by anchoring your heart in Jesus?

Choose Joy Today

Write down or speak this declaration: "Jesus is my source of joy, and no one can take it from me." Return to it anytime you feel shaken.

Prayer

Jesus, thank You that my joy in You is unshakable. Life may change, but You remain the same. Help me to guard my joy, protect my peace, and remember that no one can take away what You've given me. Amen.



Day 15: Everlasting Joy

Scripture of the Day

“And those the Lord has rescued will return. They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads. Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away.” — Isaiah 35:10

Devotional Thought

God’s rescue doesn’t just bring relief—it brings everlasting joy. This verse describes a celebration—a return to joy, to freedom, to everything God promised. And it’s not temporary. It’s not fragile. It’s joy that crowns your head and overtakes your heart.

Notice the shift: sorrow and sighing flee, not because the pain never happened, but because God’s presence replaces it with purpose, praise, and peace. That’s what redemption does.

You’ve been rescued too—maybe from sin, fear, toxic relationships, or discouragement. Your return is worth celebrating. Joy is your inheritance. And it’s not going anywhere.

Reflect

What has God rescued you from that you now carry as a testimony of joy?

Choose Joy Today

Put on your favorite upbeat worship song and sing aloud—even if it's just one verse. Let praise remind you that sorrow doesn't have the final say.

Prayer

Father, thank You for rescuing me and crowning me with joy. Help me to remember that my past doesn't define me—Your redemption does. Let gladness overtake my soul today, and may sorrow flee. Amen.



Day 16: Joy Is a Fruit

Scripture of the Day

“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness...” — Galatians 5:22

Devotional Thought

Joy is more than a feeling—it's fruit. It grows when you're connected to the Spirit of God. Just like fruit takes time to ripen, joy develops as you walk with the Lord, trust Him daily, and stay rooted in His presence.

You don't have to force joy. You don't have to fake it. You simply nurture your relationship with God, and joy will naturally begin to grow. It may start small—like a quiet smile or a moment of gratitude—but it's a sign of something beautiful happening in your spirit.

If today feels dry, don't be discouraged. God is still working in you. And joy is still growing.

Reflect

Are you tending the soil of your spiritual life in a way that allows joy to grow? What can you do to stay rooted this week?

Choose Joy Today

Prayer

Holy Spirit, thank You that joy is growing in me—even when I can't always feel it. Help me to stay connected to You so that the fruit of joy flows freely from my life. I trust You to do the work in me. Amen.



Day 17: Light and Joy Are Yours

Scripture of the Day

“Light shines on the righteous and joy on the upright in heart.” — Psalm 97:11

Devotional Thought

Joy and light go hand in hand. When you walk with integrity and keep your heart turned toward God, He surrounds you with His presence—and joy begins to rise. You don’t have to be perfect. You just need a heart that stays open to Him.

This verse is a promise: God shines His light on you. Even when life feels dark, even when you feel weary or unnoticed—He sees you, and His joy is still reaching for you.

Sisters, your righteousness isn’t earned by works but received through Christ. So stand tall, walk upright, and know that joy is your portion because God’s light is on your path.

Reflect

Where in your life do you need God's light to shine today?
How does knowing He sees your heart bring comfort?

Choose Joy Today

Open your curtains or step outside into the sunlight. Let it warm your face and remind you: God's light is shining on you—and so is His joy.

Prayer

Lord, thank You that joy shines on the upright in heart. Help me to walk in Your light and stay close to Your presence. Even when things feel unclear, remind me that You are guiding me with joy. Amen.



Day 18: Shout for Joy

Scripture of the Day

“But let all who take refuge in you be glad; let them ever sing for joy. Spread your protection over them, that those who love your name may rejoice in you.” — Psalm 5:11

Devotional Thought

Joy isn't just a feeling—it's a response. When we take refuge in God, we're not hiding in fear—we're positioning ourselves under the covering of His protection, and that's something worth rejoicing over!

David invites us to sing for joy, not because everything is perfect, but because we are loved, shielded, and seen by a faithful God. Even in life's battles, you can sing, shout, and rejoice knowing your Heavenly Father is defending you.

Don't let the enemy quiet your joy. Lift your voice. Reclaim your praise. You are covered, beloved, and free to rejoice.

Reflect

How does knowing that God protects and covers you stir joy in your heart today?

Choose Joy Today

Play a song that lifts your spirit and sing along—even if just for one verse. Let your voice remind your heart that you are safe and joyful in Him.

Prayer

Lord, I take refuge in You today. Thank You for covering me, protecting me, and surrounding me with reasons to rejoice. Let my joy be loud and my heart be glad. I trust You and love Your name. Amen.



Day 19: Yet I Will Rejoice

Scripture of the Day

“Yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior.”

— Habakkuk 3:18

Devotional Thought

Sometimes joy is a decision you make before you feel it. Habakkuk looked around and saw lack—no crops, no livestock, no visible blessings. But still, he declared, “Yet I will rejoice.”

That’s the heart of resilient joy. It doesn’t deny hardship; it rises above it. It says, “Even if I don’t see it yet, I will praise anyway.” That kind of faith catches Heaven’s attention.

Day 20: Sing for Joy

Scripture of the Day

“Rejoice in the Lord and be glad, you righteous; sing, all you who are upright in heart!” — Psalm 32:11

Devotional Thought

There’s something powerful about putting joy into motion. This verse isn’t just a suggestion—it’s a call to action: Rejoice. Be glad. Sing. Even when life is uncertain, your worship can shift the atmosphere.

Day 24: Draw Joy from the Well

Scripture of the Day

“With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.”

— Isaiah 12:3

Devotional Thought

Joy isn't just an emotion—it's a source of refreshment. When life leaves you dry, God invites you to draw deeply from His well—the well of salvation, filled with grace, peace, and yes, joy.

Scripture of the Day

“I am coming to you now, but I say these things while I am still in the world, so that they may have the full measure of my joy within them.” — John 17:13

Devotional Thought

This verse is part of Jesus’ prayer for His followers—you and me. And what did He pray for? That His joy would be in us. Not just a taste of it, but the full measure.

Jesus knew the world would be hard. He knew we’d face challenges and trials. But He also knew that His words—His truth, His presence—would anchor us in unshakable joy. A joy that doesn’t depend on what’s happening around us, but on who’s living within us.

God, I praise You for all You’ve brought me through. You’ve delivered me more times than I can count. Let my lips be quick to praise and my heart quick to rejoice. Thank You for giving me a reason to sing. Amen.



Day 30: Joy in the Right Words

Scripture of the Day

“A person finds joy in giving an apt reply—and how good is a timely word!” — Proverbs 15:23

Devotional Thought

Words carry power—and the right word at the right time can spark joy in both the giver and the receiver. Whether you’re offering encouragement, a kind response, or simply a sincere “thank you,” your words have the power to build up and bless.

Sometimes, the joy you’re looking for comes from giving it away. A compliment, a prayer, a text of appreciation—these small gestures carry big impact. When your heart is open and your words flow from love, joy follows closely behind.

Be intentional today. Speak life. Be the reason someone smiles—and watch how joy fills your own heart in the process.

Reflect

When was the last time someone's words lifted you up? How can you pass that same joy to someone else today?
